ADC Campsite - Martin Dale

The Campsite has been incredibly busy in the last year ensuring that all the relevant safety certificates were bought completely up to date. There have been many changes at the site for the better and will continue to be ongoing as we progress towards the summer months. There is now a new alarm system to deter unwanted visitors to the site which should increase security as the new housing development progresses. We are monitored by a call centre that has a guard on standby 24 hours to give us peace of mind. This year we intend to replace the boilers and all the windows along with new flooring both upstairs and downstairs.

The lease is now in its final stages: we have agreed a 30 year lease with Hants County Council and a rental of £500 (much lower than the initial £5,000 that they requested). We now have to wait for The Scout Association Trust Corporation to review the terms and accept on our behalf.

There were a few workshop weekends where scouting members from Itchen North and 17th Itchen South helped out with a few more planned for this year.

International groups visited the site including the Belgians who stayed for two weeks using Tesco as their spiritual home as there were so many of them to feed. An international day was held in their honour where youth members from Itchen South and Southampton City, as well as Adam Jollans, entertained them. There were also visits from German and French Groups on weekend camps. A Filipino Group stayed at the site which included visitors from around the world who met with them. EBC Think Safe enjoyed their week educating young school children from around the area with visits from the police and fire brigade amongst others.

After a delayed start to my appointment as Local Training Manager for Itchen South, I am now getting into the swing of things. I would still urge all Leaders to log on to Compass and ensure that their own records, as held, are correct. If there are any problems, please let me know – I can't promise to sort it, but I can ask the questions and find some-one who can!

"Getting Started" courses are continuing to be run most months, now alternating between Sunday mornings, Tuesday or Thursday evenings, trying to cater for everyone; as well as many Leaders completing the e-learning courses. Please remember that a copy of all e-learning certificates should be sent to your Training Adviser, or to Sharon Ross, or myself, and will still require the module to be validated.

The Adults Personal File has again been updated by HQ, with specific copies now for Section Leaders, Managers & Supporters, Non Wood Badge Appointments, and Supplementary Modules; as well as an additional Training Adviser's Guide specifically for Managers & Supporters (or M&S!).

I would like to thank all the Training Advisers who have taken on this additional role, helping other Leaders to achieve their Wood Beads, which now entails imputing their validating directly into Compass. It seems to be working well, and if anyone wants additional help, please ask. Now that TA's are able to validate Modules 1 – 3 within their own Group, getting Leaders onto full appointments should be much quicker and easier. If any Group does not have a TA within it, Module 25's are regularly being run, and this can also be used as mandatory On Going Learning.

I would like to thank Jen Upton, Local Training Manager for Itchen North for keeping the TA's meetings going until I took over for Itchen South. I'd also like to thank Aileen Wood and June Burton for all their help with running courses (and refreshments!), and keeping the administration for new Leaders up to date; as well as Su and Gordon Brakewell, for their help sitting on the Appointments Committee.

I'd also like to thank Sharon Ross as DC (she is now on my speed dial!) for all her help, as well as chasing Leaders who should be on the various courses as required.

Lastly, congratulations to all the Leaders who have completed their Wood Beads, and those that are in the process of going through their training.

Well done all, and let's have everyone fully trained!

Canoe Centre - Joan Veal, ADC Activities

Centre spent the beginning of the year running its winter paddle training programme at Hamble Community Sports Centres pool with all sessions being full.

In April the Centre returned to lakeside for the outdoor programme. There has been an increase in the number of young people attending. The Centre is still running the PaddlePower scheme which the young people are progressing well.

Though out the season the Centre carried on with its Saturday Club running the PaddlePower scheme, also assessing the Scout Association Paddlesport and Time on Water Badges. With all the young people progressing well.

The Centre has a Duke of Edinburgh's Award Group training for their Silver Waterborne Expedition and completed their expedition in July on the River Wye.

This year the Taster/Casual evening sessions have been fully booked. July saw the end of the Centres main season for casual sessions for local Scout and Guide units, with all sessions being well supported.

In August two of our Level 1 Coach Lyn Jack and Shawn Moore were successful in their Level2 Coach assessments.

Several river trips have been run for the juniors on, also there have been several visits to Lea Valley.

The Centre has run several low level river trips on the Hamble, Itchen, Stour and Medway for the younger paddlers and Rivers Dart, Barle Lea Valley for the more experienced ones and adults. All of these have been well attended

Lakeside held an open day in September to promote the new Centre Buildings, with the Centre putting on a paddlesport display. The Centre moved into the new storage Building and changing rooms at the beginning of November
